#### CONTEXT

Business Development Services (BDS) support is an intervention by EnDev Uganda aimed at identifying business knowledge and development gaps for small and medium enterprises (SMEs) operating in the solar and cooking sub-sectors in Uganda. Launched in 2021, the BDS intervention is entering its 3<sup>rd</sup> implementation phase with the major objective of improving the internal capacities of solar and cooking companies in the areas of strategic planning, financial management, operations, human resource management, marketing and investment readiness. Through this support, EnDev Uganda is contributing towards building a vibrant and sustainable energy market in Uganda.

#### SCALING POTENTIAL

There is an opportunity for the BDS programme to evolve to involve expert trainings on new areas of interest in the renewable energy space like gender mainstreaming, occupational health and safety, digitalization and climate financing.

There is also potential for sector associations like Uganda Solar Energy Association (USEA) and Uganda National Alliance for Clean Cooking (UNACC) to play a more integral role by being information hubs and training centers for their member companies in the areas of business development and advisory. This builds sectoral and institutional capacity, improves formalization and SME sustainability.

- Implementation of the BDS can in future be done through a framework arrangement following a defined curriculum that will allow for more tailored and extensive support and mentorship to solar and cooking companies in Uganda.
- Widening of the implementor base for BDS with more business advisory firms.
- Collaboration with other programmes with BDS components e.g. GET.Invest, Energy Enterprise Coach (EEC) and other financiers
- Increased involvement of BDS consultants and beneficiary companies in other projects in the energy sector.

Improved cook stoves for a better life



Energising Development Uganda uses a performance-based incentive approach for the Result Based Finance (RBF) to facilitate access to solar systems and clean cooking solutions. The RBF programme supports energy enterprises to increase their sales and distribution outreach for clean cooking and solar systems across various tier ranges to households, social institutions, and MSMEs. To further support market growth, EnDev Uganda partners with the sector associations in the cooking and solar sector to promote awareness, build capacity of the enterprises and forge new partnerships. The sales data is independently verified using a robust monitoring and verification framework with support from independent verifies. Results from such verification processes have often provided key insights which informs the different RBF approaches that are utilized by EnDev Uganda. For example, in 2023, EnDev Uganda initiated collaborations with Fund Managers like Equity Bank, Private Sector Foundation Uganda who further provide additional technical support to the RBF partners. The energy enterprises have the leverage existing opportunities with these fund managers like Equity bank to access finance and further scale their operations.
