

Africa Biogas Component Kenya

1.1 **Preamble**

This document has been prepared by GIZ – EnDev Kenya to give an overview of the EnDev - African Biodigester Component (ABC) in Kenya and provide guidance for potential applicants applying for the EnDev ABC RBF facility.

1.2 About EnDev Kenya

The Energising Development (EnDev) programme is a strategic partnership of likeminded donors to promote energy access. EnDev is funded by the German Federal Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ), the Netherlands Ministry of Foreign Affairs (DGIS), the Norwegian Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Norwegian Agency for Development Cooperation (NORAD) and the Swiss Agency for Development and Cooperation (SDC). Further funding has been provided by the European Union, USAID's Power Africa and the IKEA Foundation. The programme is implemented in close cooperation with leading international organizations and key local stakeholders. The programme is co-managed by the Deutsche Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GIZ) GmbH and the Netherlands Enterprise Agency (RVO.nl). EnDev works in more than 20 countries across Africa, Asia and Latin America.

Energising Development Kenya (EnDev Kenya) project promotes and facilitates access to modern and sustainable energy solutions for households, social institutions and MSMEs predominantly in rural and peri-urban areas.

1.3 EnDev - African Biodigester Component (ABC)

The EnDev - African Biodigester Component (ABC) aims to support the growth and sustainability of a commercial biodigester sector in Sub-Saharan Africa. The intervention will result in the installation of at least 50,000 small scale biodigesters by 2025 across Burkina Faso, Kenya, Mali, Niger and Uganda providing energy access for at least 250,000 people.

The ABC intervention in Kenya (2022 to 2025) aims at facilitating a shift of the biodigester market from its pioneering to the expansion phase with focus on the installation of over 20,000 small-scale and 250 medium scale biodigesters.

This will be achieved by means of a well-balanced mix of demand-side, supply side, financing and enabling environment interventions, geared at boosting demand and supporting smallscale and medium scale biodigester companies in acquiring more clients. The project is implemented by a consortium of GIZ and SNV in partnership with ABPL (ex-KBP).

A Result-Based Finance (RBF) facility for small-scale biodigesters will be the core instrument of the Africa Biogas Component (ABC) Project. Through the provision of result-based financing, the Project expects to provide the last push needed for the biodigester market to reach a critical mass of clients within Kenyan farmers. This is expected to enable suppliers of small-scale biodigesters to achieve economies of scale, the market to be firmly rooted in the expansion phase and become self-sustainable.

Beyond the RBF incentive support, the project will:

- Stimulate the adoption of biodigesters through information and awareness raising and maximise end-user benefits through the valorisation of biogas and other by-products, such as bio-slurry and compost.
- Provide Business Development Support (BDS) to biodigester companies through an e-learning platform, cohort training as well as one-to-one coaching to achieve the professionalization of the sector. Critical training areas include business formalisation, bookkeeping, staffing, tax compliance, institutional capacity to participate in public tenders, marketing and pitching skills.
- Biodigester companies will be able to benefit from three levels of access to finance (A2F) support: (i) the general A2F strategy defined with (micro)finance institutions (ii) loans from €25,000 to €250,000¹ and the effect of (iii) the RBF incentives provided to Financial Institutions providing credits to biodigester customers.
- Support the enabling environment by ensuring the policies, regulations, standards and • tax regimes are conducive to the development of biodigester companies. The ABC project will also build the capacity of partner organisations and public stakeholders at national and county level on the benefits of biodigesters.
- Biodigester companies will benefit from technical trainings of their own staff, of financial • institutions on the benefit of biogas and bioslurry. We will also support knowledge creation and provide market intelligence (biodigester potential in Kenya, Uganda, Somalia and South Sudan, lessons learnt from biodigester market development...)
- The project will strengthen the biodigester business model for end users by supporting the valorisation, application and trading of bio-slurry and bio-slurry enriched compost. The ABC project will organize a yearly Biogas Valorisation Challenge rewarding the best biogas valorization options for medium scale biodigesters. The winner will be rewarded with a money prize, as well as media coverage.

Overview of the RBF Facility 1.4

A Result-Based Finance (RBF) facility will be the core instrument of the project for small-scale biodigesters. The project shall provide financial incentives to eligible enterprises in line with pre-agreed results. However, the incentives shall be used to support the participating beneficiaries to mitigate specific temporary market barriers in order to deliver the results in a sustainable manner.

1.5 Technical assistance for companies not meeting the eligibility criteria for the RBF

This is mainly targeting biogas enterprises/individual entrepreneurs who do not meet the RBF eligibility criteria. Under this option, there is no flow of funds to the enterprises/entrepreneurs (including technicians and individual masons).

Under this arrangement, GIZ and the selected enterprises/entrepreneurs shall plan, allocate and agree the measures/work packages to be supported including the contribution from each party. The activities are thereafter facilitated by GIZ in line with **GIZ financial and procurement processes**.

The support may include but not limited to:

- a) Marketing and market development: promotional activities focusing on awareness creation to create demand
- b) Business development support services
- c) Training and capacity building of biogas technicians
- d) Support in Business-to-Business linkages.
- e) Facilitate linkage to consumer financing opportunities

1.6 Modes of Engagement with participating biogas enterprises

GIZ has two modalities for engaging private sector companies under the umbrella of integrated development partnership with private sector i.e. **Grant Agreement (GA)** and **Technical Assistance (TA)**.

- Grant Agreement (GA): GIZ provides a financial contribution to the selected biogas enterprise partner, whereas the enterprise is responsible for implementation and delivery of results. This will only be used for the RBF Facility.
- Service Contracts: GIZ shall initiate a competitive tender with clearly specified deliverables. The biogas enterprises shall be invited to apply by submitting technical and financial proposals after which they are evaluated, and eligible applicants selected. This will only be used for the **RBF facility**.
- Technical Assistance (TA): no money flow between partners and partners co-implement agreed upon measures. This will mainly target enterprises/individuals who do not meet the RBF eligibility criteria.

1.8 Implementation roadmap RBF Facility

a) Call for Expression of Interest

The call for Expressions of Interest (EoI) for 2022 commences on 1st April 2022 and applications are accepted from interested companies/organizations on a rolling basis until 20th May 2022 (extended). GIZ shall evaluate the Expressions of Interest and carry out due diligence process and thereafter the applicants will be informed on their eligibility to participate in the project. More information on this Call can be accessed in https://endev.info/calls/.

Interested applicants shall be required to fill in an application template available at https://endev.info/calls/ and submit via email to info-energyke@giz.de. The application deadline is 20th May 2022 (extended).

EnDev ABC shall also organise a virtual orientation for this call for Expression of Interest on Thursday 14th April 2022 (already passed!). Interested applicants needing more orientation on the Expression of Interest should register for this meeting by 10th April 2022 (already passed!). An orientation on the call for this Expression of Interest will be elaborated during the workshop.

b) Development of the incentive structure

As the call for Expression of Interest is ongoing, the incentive structure design shall be running in parallel and this shall be concluded before the proposal development and contracting stage.

c) Proposal development

The shortlisted applicants shall be required to prepare proposals, workplans and budgets of specific measures to be supported by the project. These shall be done using GIZ prescribed templates. GIZ shall support and facilitate the applicants during this stage to facilitate a fast turn-around.

d) Review and approval of the proposals

The proposals, workplans and budgets shall be submitted to GIZ for review and approval.

e) Contracting

Upon the approval of the proposal, workplan and budgets, GIZ will enter into an agreement with the selected enterprises. The terms and scope of implementation including the targets shall be stipulated in the agreements/contracts (mentioned above). This shall be agreed upon prior to the completion of the agreements/contracts.

f) Performance based support monitoring

The continuity of support from EnDev-ABC Kenya shall be based on the achievement of pre-agreed results in-line with the key indicators and targets of the activity framework and more particularly on the number of biodigesters sold to end consumers. This shall be assessed quarterly based on the achievement of quarterly targets.
